But there *is* a God, and He *has* spoken. And He speaks not to accuse us or restrict us but to draw us closer to Himself and lead us to righteousness, holiness, freedom, and fulfillment.

MESSAGE 1

Ten Commandments or Ten Suggestions

"And God spoke all these words..." (Exodus 20:1–17)

HY STUDY AN ANCIENT LEGAL CODE? The Ten Commandments are God's Word: His absolute truth and unwavering standards, revealing His holiness and how to live a life pleasing to God.

The Ten Commandments were given by God to a redeemed people

- These commandments were at the heart of the Law revealed to Israel, God's chosen people.
- These commandments were given to Israel after God had delivered them from Egypt. God is telling His people how they are to live.

The purpose of the Ten Words

- The Ten Words were not a way of salvation. They were the standard of conduct for God's people and the basis of the Mosaic covenant.
- The Ten Words reveal the holiness and the glory of God. And they reveal our sinfulness and need for a Savior.

The Ten Words are commandments, not suggestions

- The Ten Commandments are to be obeyed.
- In their totality, the Ten Commandments are positive.
- Israel quickly broke the Ten Commandments.

Why is it important to understand that the Ten Commandments were given by God to His people versus pagan unbelievers?
Why is it a mistake to see the Ten Commandments as a ladder we climb in order to be saved?
What was the three-fold promise that God made if Israel kept the Mosaic covenant? What happened?
Why should followers of Jesus obey the Ten Commandments?

MESSAGE 2

The First Commandment: No Other Gods

ANY PEOPLE MAY SAY THEY BELIEVE in God, but what God or gods do they actually believe in? It is essential we know and worship the true God, not a god whom we have constructed.

The Lord is the unique God

- The Lord is the unique God because of who He is: "I AM who I AM" (Exodus 3:14). He is eternal, almighty, unchanging, perfect, and holy.
- The Lord is the unique God because of what He has done: He is Creator and Redeemer.

Therefore this unique God will have no rivals

- The Lord is a jealous God, seeking a relationship with us. It is to be the most important relationship in our lives.
- We must have no false gods. God and God alone must be number one in your life

QUESTIONS FOR REVIEW

Consider the A.W. Tozer quote, "What comes into our minds when we think about God is the most important thing about us." What comes into *your* mind when you think about God?

And God spoke all these words, saying, "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. You shall have no other gods before me."

— Exodus 20:1–3

Why does the name of God (YHWH) tell us so much about who He is?
We usually think of jealousy as being an ugly word. Why is this term used to describe God in relation to the first commandment?

MESSAGE 3

The Second Commandment: Worship God's Way

TOT ONLY ARE WE TO WORSHIP the correct God, the correct God must be worshiped in the correct way. We must worship God in the way He has prescribed.

No symbols or representations of God are to be made or worshiped

- False worship distorts, obscures, and limits a true concept of God.
- False worship focuses on man's imagination and creativity rather than God's revelation.
- False worship fashions God according to the surrounding culture.

The true God opposes false worshipers

- A violation of the second commandment is serious.
- God opposes false worshipers.

We seek to be biblical worshipers

- God commands us to worship Him.
- Biblical worship is God-centered.
- Biblical worship is Christ-centered.
- Biblical worship is Word-centered.
- Biblical worship involves our heads, hearts, and wills.



"You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I the LORD your God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and the fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing steadfast love to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments."

— Exodus 20:4–6

How does the second commandment (worshiping God's way) build on the first commandment (our view of God)?

MESSAGE 4

The Third Commandment: In God's Name

In the LORD'S PRAYER, JESUS TAUGHT His disciples to pray, "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name" (Matthew 6:9). God's name is to be hallowed; it is to be reverenced and honored.

The Lord's name is very precious

- Names are important.
- The name of the Lord is very important and significant.

We break this commandment when...

- We use the Lord's name **profanely.**
- We use the Lord's name carelessly.
- We use the Lord's name casually.

We break this commandment when...

- We misappropriate the Lord's name to underline our own words.
- We misappropriate God's name to underline our spirituality.

We break this commandment when...

- We praise the name of the Lord with our lips, but deny Him with our lives.
- Don't say that you are a Christian, and then live like a non-Christian.

You will be saved and cleansed by calling on the name of the Lord (Romans 10:13)

- You need a change of heart.
- Call on the name of the Lord and be saved.



"You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain."

— Exodus 20:7

What are some of the names of the Lord? What do they reveal about His character, reputation, and nature?
Does it surprise you that using the Lord's name carelessly or casually applies in this commandment? Why or why not?
How does using the Lord's name in a pseudo-spiritual way break this commandment?
Why is the name of Jesus Christ the most precious, the most exalted, and the most powerful name in all of the universe?

What aspects of this commandment are most convicting to you? How will you change your mindset and approach?

MESSAGE 5

The Fourth Commandment: A Day of Rest

THE FOURTH COMMANDMENT is probably the most controversial of the Ten Commandments. It is the only commandment not specifically repeated in the New Testament. Does it merely relate to the ceremonial law of Israel, or is there an abiding principle for us today?

The Sabbath was to be kept holy

- The Sabbath was not given as a burden but as a gracious gift by God to His people.
- On the Sabbath, no work was to be done. The aspect of rest is emphasized.

The reasons for the Sabbath

- Creation called for a Sabbath: a rest of delight.
- Redemption called for a Sabbath: a day of celebration and a sign of the special relationship between God and His people.

The benefits of the Sabbath

- The benefit of rest
- The benefit of worship

The application of the Sabbath

- Consider the New Testament concept of the Lord's Day versus the Sabbath as a sign of the old covenant.
- The Sabbath has its fulfillment in Jesus Christ.



"Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, 10 but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy."

— Exodus 20:8–11

Why is it helpful to understand that God initially gave the Sabbath as a blessing, not a burden?
What does a day of rest signify?
How can your view of the fourth commandment impact your view of worship?
What is the difference between the Lord's Day and the Sabbath?

Are you experiencing the true and abiding rest found in Jesus Christ?

MESSAGE 6

The Fifth Commandment: Family Relationships

HILE THERE IS NO PERFECT FAMILY, the principal place for our spiritual, moral, behavioral, and emotional training is within the home. It is clear that the family is essential to God and society.

Why should we obey the fifth commandment?

- It is a command of God.
- It is a command with a promise.
- Obedience is the right thing to do.
- If you honor your parents, your children will honor you when you are old (as a general rule).

How do we obey the fifth commandment?

- We honor our parents by obeying them.
- We honor our parents by loving them.
- We honor our parents *by respecting* them and submitting to their discipline.
- We honor our parents *by caring* for them in their old age.

MESSAGE 7

The Sixth Commandment: The Sanctity of Life

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS ARE A MIRROR revealing God's holy standards. The sixth commandment may seem to be one where we may have fewer struggles, but consider its implications carefully.

What is murder?


- The literal translation prohibits the unlawful taking of another person's life.
- There are situations where the deliberate taking of human life is not unlawful.

Why is murder wrong?

- "You shall not murder" is a command of God. He has all power and all authority.
- We are made in the image of God. Therefore, each life is precious and sacred.
- God gives life and sustains life. He is in control over life and death.

How does the sixth commandment apply to us in our society?

- Murder by the hand is wrong.
- Abortion is the taking of innocent life and is forbidden by God.
- The intentional killing of a person because of his/her present or foreseeable medical condition or quality of life (euthanasia) is wrong.
- Suicide is wrong.
- Attitudes of hate and vengeance are murder of the heart.



What are some situations where the taking of human life is not unlawful?
Why is our understanding of the one true God and His sovereignty central to why murder is wrong?
Why is abortion a violation of the sixth commandment? Is suicide the unforgivable sin?
What is "murder of the heart"? What is at the root of murder?
THE VERDICT IS YOURS Do you see how the attitudes of hate and vengeance are opposed to God's purposes of love and life?
Have you been transformed by the love of God in Jesus Christ? Have you experienced anger or hate being replaced by the love of God?

MESSAGE 8

The Seventh Commandment: The Sexual Revolution

As followers of Jesus, we see our sexuality as a beautiful and precious gift of God. It should be expressed according to our Creator's instruction, not abused or cheapened.

God designed sex to take place within the sanctity of marriage


- God ordained marriage as a unique union between one man and one woman for life.
- The seventh commandment is designed to protect the marriage union and the family.

How may adultery be committed?

- By the physical act of adultery
- By adultery in the heart
- By unbiblical divorce and remarriage

Why is adultery wrong?

- Adultery defies God. Our society may think that casual sexual liaisons are acceptable, but God's standards on sexual purity do not change.
- Adultery desecrates the marriage vows.
- Adultery denies true love in favor of selfish lust.
- Adultery destroys families.
- Adultery defiles the body.



What is so significant and special about the marriage union?
Why does sexual immorality damage the soul?
What are examples of adultery of the heart?

MESSAGE 9

The Eight Commandment: Don't Steal

S CHRISTIANS, WE RECOGNIZE that God owns everything. When we receive something from the good hand of God, it is not wrong to own it. But it is wrong to take anything that belongs to someone else. In our society, theft has reached epidemic proportions.

Ways we break the eighth commandment


- By obvious theft Many people think that stealing from the rich, a large store, an institution, or the government is acceptable. It is not.
- By deceitfully depriving someone of what is lawfully their — extortion, embezzlement, cheating, filing false claims, and fraud.
- By borrowing money or goods and failing to return them — unpaid debts.
- By depriving someone of the fruit of their labor

 unauthorized copies, withholding fair wages

 and tips.
- By exploiting others lying about a product, overcharging for work or professional services.
- By misusing your employer's property and time.
- By withholding money due to the government.
- By robbing God.

Ways to keep the eighth commandment

- Work hard.
- Give generously.
- Be content.

MESSAGE 10

The Ninth Commandment: The Truth and Nothing but the Truth

In politics, business, sports, and in personal relationships, lying has become socially acceptable and even institutionalized.

Two reasons why false witness is sinful


- Lying is sinful because God hates lying. As followers of Christ, we believe in absolute truth.
- Lying is sinful because of the value of the individual.
 We are to treat one another with integrity, respect, and dignity. Without honesty, the framework of our society begins to crumble.

Examples of false witness

- Perjury
- Lying and false accusations
- Slander and gossip
- Flattery

Two specific examples

- Jesus sets out the biblical procedure for resolution (Matthew 18:15–20).
- The dishonesty and deceit of Ananias and Sapphira (Acts 5:1–11)

Why is the devil identified as "the father of lies"?
Think of lies you have told or encountered in your life. How have those lies destroyed trust and caused problems?

Are you trustworthy? Are you committed to a lifestyle of truth? Is there any deception or hypocrisy in your life?

MESSAGE 11

The Tenth Commandment: Don't Covet

EW OF US HAVE SERVANTS or oxen and donkeys, but we continue to be envious of the success and the possessions of others.

Three things about the sin of covetousness

- Covetousness is a sin of the heart. Other sins often become known to others, but covetousness deals not so much with our outward actions as with our inward attitudes.
- Covetousness is a sin of dissatisfaction and selfishness. The covetous person is never satisfied with what he/she has.
- Covetousness is a springboard to other sins.

The Law and sin

 Three things to remember about the Law (God's commandments):

The Law defines sin and reveals sin.

The Law stimulates sin. The Law by itself is good, but we resent the restrictions and want to do the very things we are told not to do.

The Law is powerless over sin. It cannot give us the power to obey the commands of God.

• Two things about sin:

Sin seems so alluring, but it deceives.

Sin not only deceives, but it kills. The wages of sin is death (Romans 6:23).



"You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his male servant, or his female servant, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is your neighbor's."

— Exodus 20:17

- Contentment Accept what God has for you.
- Faith Trust in God, that He will provide for all of your needs.
- Cleansing We need new life, divine cleansing, and divine power

MESSAGE 12

The Greatest Commandment: Love

"And one of the scribes came up and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, asked him, "Which commandment is the most important of all?" Jesus answered, "The most important is, 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." And the scribe said to him, "You are right, Teacher. You have truly said that he is one, and there is no other besides him. And to love him with all the heart and with all the understanding and with all the strength, and to love one's neighbor as oneself, is much more than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices." And when Jesus saw that he answered wisely, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." — Mark 12:28–34

HAT DOES JESUS SAY about the Ten Commandments? In Mark 12:28–34, Jesus is asked, "What the greatest of the commandments?"

Love is the fulfillment of the Law

- Love is the essence of the Law. All of the commandments can be summarized by perfectly loving the Lord and loving our neighbor.
- Jesus Christ, who is perfect love, is the total and perfect fulfillment of the Law.
- Because Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of the Law, authentic followers of Jesus are not under the Mosaic law, but the law of Christ.

Love God supremely and totally

- Love God supremely our love cannot be divided.
- Love God totally we are to love God with all of our heart, soul, mind and strength.
- Love others with this divine love.
