"Revelation" denotes something hidden now being revealed. It is a revelation given by Jesus Christ to the apostle John about "the things that must soon take place." While we focused first on chapters 1–3, then on chapters 4–14, we now come to the final chapters (15–22). The center of our study remains the matchless and majestic Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God, our Lord and Master and soon coming King.

There is also a special blessing given to those who read and hear "the words of this prophecy" (Revelation 1:3). So I invite you to join me in this exciting exploration and receive the blessing of God.

MESSAGE 25

The End is Near

Revelation 15

AS WE RESUME OUR STUDIES IN CHAPTER 15, here is a brief reminder of the context.

The next event in God's prophetic calendar is the Rapture of the church. After the Rapture, various events will happen on earth. There will be a period of seven years, called the Tribulation, when God's judgment descends on the earth. During this time, the Antichrist will rise to power. But God is at work and there are witnesses to Jesus Christ throughout the Tribulation, including the 144,000 Jewish believers and the two witnesses who are killed, resurrected, and caught up to heaven.

As we come to Revelation 15, we are approaching the end of the Tribulation period when the seven bowls (the culmination of God's wrath) will fall on a sinful world. Revelation 15 gives the context and preparation of the seven bowls which contain the seven plagues. The particulars of the seven bowls are described in Revelation 17 (the next message).

- The song of the redeemed (v 1-3a)
- The object of worship (v 3b-4)

The wrath of the Lord (v 5-8)

- The culmination of the wrath of God

MESSAGE 26

Armageddon

Revelation 16

THERE IS THE VIEW THAT WE SHOULDN'T MENTION the judgment of God as we don't want to frighten people. But the Bible contains warnings for our good, and the wonder of the grace of God is that all of us may be delivered from this coming judgment. But for those who prefer to go their own way, how do they respond to the judgment of God?

The context

The command to the seven angels

Seven bowls are poured out on the earth.

- The first bowl (v 2): harmful and painful sores on people with the mark of the beast.
- The second bowl (v 3): the sea becomes like blood.
- The third bowl (v 4-7): the fresh waters become blood
- The fourth bowl (v 8-9): people are scorched by fierce heat
- The fifth bowl (v 10-11): the beast's kingdom is plunged into darkness.
- The sixth bowl (v 12-15): the river Euphrates is dried up
- The seventh bowl (v 17-21): lightning, thunder, and a great earthquake which causes the cities of the nations to fall.

What is the significance of each of these judgments? How do they remind you of the plagues of Egypt?
What is the response of the people to the judgment of God?
What is the significance of Armageddon? Who will be assembling there? Why?
How is the cry "It is done" different from the previous cry on the cross, "It is finished"?

Are you surprised by the reaction of the people? Does this impact your view of God's judgment?
When have you experienced a hard heart? Did you repent, or is your heart still hard towards God?

MESSAGE 27

Global Religion

Revelation 17

BEFORE DESCRIBING THE RETURN OF OUR LORD JESUS, the apostle John steps back and writes about a global religion, Babylon, which is going to rise to power during the Tribulation. In Scripture Babylon refers not only to a specific city, but to a system which is anti-God.

MESSAGE 28

The Fall of Babylon

Revelation 18

BABYLON IS MORE THAN A CITY: it is a man-made and man-centered religion characterized by defiance, open rebellion against God, and the enthronement of self. In Revelation 17 Babylon is pictured as a great prostitute in control of the Antichrist and the kings on earth. But halfway through the Tribulation the Antichrist and his kings turn on her and destroy her.

The announcement of the fall of Babylon

- The destruction of Babylon is announced (v 1-3)
- The reasons for the destruction of Babylon (v 5-8)
- The historical example of Babylon's fall (Daniel 5)

The lament of the fall of Babylon

- Babylon's destruction is lamented by the kings of the earth (v 9-10).
- Babylon's destruction is lamented by the merchants of the earth (v 11-17a).

The final prophecy of the fall of Babylon

Babylon will be utterly and irretrievably destroyed (v 21-24).

MESSAGE 29

Hallelujah

Revelation 19:1-10

WHEN WE COME TO REVELATION 19, a victory is being celebrated. The last seal has been broken. The last trumpet has sounded. The last bowl has been poured out. Babylon has been destroyed. The stage is now set for the return to earth of Jesus Christ, the King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

The celebration of the judgment of Babylon

- The first two hallelujahs celebrate the eternal destruction of Babylon, and the vengeance of the blood of the martyrs (v 1-3).

MESSAGE 30

King of Kings and Lord of Lords

Revelation 19:11-21

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST DIED FOR OUR SINS, was buried, and rose again. Now He is alive forevermore and He is coming back! And when He returns, He will execute His victory so that all evil will be punished, and every injustice will be put right. This is a message of triumph and hope for those who are trusting the Lord Jesus, but a message of judgment for those who do not know Him.

The Lord Jesus, the living Christ, is coming back (v 11-16).

- The Lord Jesus is returning as the victorious King of kings and Lord of lords.
- Christ's second coming is in power, majesty, and triumph, demonstrating His sovereignty.

The Lord Jesus is victorious at Armageddon (v 17-21).

The "Great Supper of God" is prepared for the birds of the air to feast on the enemies of God.

MESSAGE 31

The Reign of Christ

Revelation 20:1-10

THE RETURN OF OUR SAVIOR will be followed by the millennium, the 1,000-year reign of our Lord Jesus Christ which will then continue for all eternity.

The second coming of Jesus Christ is followed by the Millennial Kingdom.

- The millennium is a literal 1,000-year reign on earth by Jesus Christ as King of kings and Lord of lords.
- Amillennialism denies a literal millennium.
- Postmillennialism believes that the second coming of Jesus Christ will occur after the millennium.

The earth will be transformed during the Millennial Kingdom.

- Christ will reign over all the earth for 1,000 years (a millennium).
- During the millennium the curse on the earth will be removed.

What are the problems with the views of Amillennialism and Postmillennialism? What is your view?	
What promises are fulfilled during the millennium? What is the earth like? What will believers be doing?	
What happens to the devil during the millennium?

MESSAGE 32

The Final Judgment

Revelation 20:11-15

DO YOU BELIEVE IN ETERNAL PUNISHMENT? The subject of hell is rejected out of hand by many, but no one spoke more about hell than our Lord Jesus Christ. Central to His teaching, central to His mission, is the reality of eternal punishment. In this message we are considering that future day from which there is no escape; that day when eternal destinies are forever sealed: that day of the final judgment.

The Judge (v 11)

- God is on the throne.
- God is the perfect and just Judge.

The Defendants (v 12a)

- John saw the dead.
- Regardless of the circumstances of their death, all unbelievers will be there (13a).

The Trial (v 12b-13)

- God is the divine bookkeeper.
- The book of life is opened.

The Verdict and the Penalty (v 14-15)

• The verdict is final and irrevocable.

Is the reality of eternal punishment inconsistent with the character of God? Why is eternal punishment necessary?
Why is it important that God is the judge?
Who will stand before the throne of God?
What books are referenced? Why are they significant?
What is the penalty for those not saved? What is the difference between Hades and Hell? What are we told about Hell, the "lake of fire"?

Do you believe in eternal punishment?
Is your name written in the Book of Life? Do you know with certainty that you have been saved by the supernatural work of the Holy Spirit and vs. having a mere profession of salvation?

MESSAGE 33

The New Heaven and the New Earth

Revelation 21:1-8

WHAT IS YOUR VIEW OF HEAVEN? We hear of various personal accounts of those who claim to have gone to heaven, and we may have many unanswered questions about heaven ourselves, but God has revealed in His Word all that He wants us to know. Revelation 21 and 22 are the final two chapters of Revelation and the entire Bible, and they are about the new heaven and the new earth.

What is Heaven like?

ł	Heaven (the	new heaven	and the new	earth) is God's n	ew creation	(v 1-:	2).
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- Heaven is the presence of God (v 3).
- Heaven is the removal of all evil (v 4).

• Heaven is for believers only (v 5-8).

Why is significant that the new heaven and the new earth will be "new"?

How is God's gracious invitation (v 6) similar to the invitation given previously by Jesus (John 4:13-14)?

MESSAGE 34

The New Jerusalem

Revelation 21:9-22:5

THE NEW JERUSALEM COMES DOWN FROM HEAVEN and rests on the new earth, the center of the universe. This is the capital city of the new heaven and earth—the eternal home of followers of Jesus Christ.

A description of the new Jerusalem.

• The new Jerusalem is a place of indescribable glory and beauty (21:9-27).

What shall we do in Heaven?

- In Heaven we will be at home, enjoying perfect communion and fellowship with all the redeemed.
- In Heaven we will worship the Lamb, and we will see His face (v 22:1-5).

REVIEW QUESTIONS

What are some of the characteristics of the new Jerusalem?

Why is there no temple and no sun?

Why is it significant to think that Heaven is home for believers?
Will we know each other in Heaven?
Why is it so amazing to think that we will see God's face?

In Revelation 21:7 we read of the new Jerusalem: "Nothing unclean will ever enter it, nor anyone who does what is detestable or false, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of Life." Do you know that your name is written in the Lamb's book of life? Have you trusted in our Lord Jesus Christ?
Today meditate on the grace of God. God not only saves us; He takes us into His own home, into the Father's house, into His own presence to live with Him for eternity. What marvelous, amazing grace is this? And what a glorious day this will be!

MESSAGE 35

He's Coming Soon

Revelation 22:7, 12, 20

THE APOSTLE PAUL ENCOURAGES BELIEVERS in the Lord Jesus to be looking "for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ" (Titus 2:13). At any moment our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ, will come again. And when He comes, He comes for those saved by His amazing grace. Everyone else will be left behind.

Our Lord Jesus is coming at any moment.

- Jesus is coming back prior to the Tribulation (the Rapture).
- Reasons why we believe that the Rapture of the church is before the Tribulation

Three responses to the Lord's soon return

- Be alert: don't lose focus (1 Thessalonians 1:9-10).
- Be holy: don't compromise (Titus 2:13-14; John 3:2-3).
- Be ready: don't be left behind (John 14:4-6).

MESSAGE 36

The Time is Near

Revelation 22:6-21

AS WE COMPLETE OUR STUDY, YOU MAY STILL HAVE QUESTIONS, but our goal has not been to be speculative or sensational or to force current events into the text, but rather to allow God's Word to speak to us. To conclude, let's focus on three final points:

Remember why the message of Revelation is given:

- An encouragement to persevere
- The consummation of God's promises at the end of the age
- The exaltation of the Lamb of God

The basic outline of Revelation

- The things which are (1:19)—chapter 1 ("the things which you have seen") and chapters 2 and 3: the letters to the seven churches ("the things which are").
- The things which are to take place "after this" (1:19) (comprises chapters 4-22): the throne room of God (chapters 4-5); the Tribulation (chapters 6-18); the rise and fall of Babylon (chapters 17-18); the return of Jesus Christ (chapter 19); the Millennial Kingdom (20:1-10); the final judgment (20:11-15); and the new heaven and the new earth (chapters 21-22).

The Epilogue

- This prophecy is absolutely accurate (v 6-9).
- A final warning given by the Lord Jesus (v 10-15).
- A final invitation and final warning are given (v 17-21).
